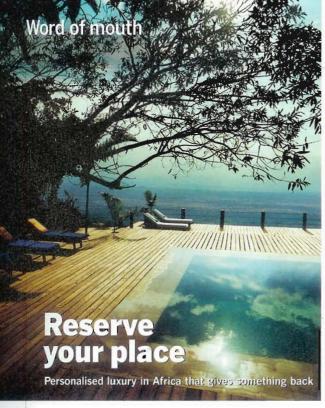

Safari in style Two travel trends in Kenya – private houses and community-led conservation – are reflected in new initiatives in the north and south. The Sanctuary at OI Lentille is a venture between British businessman John Elias, the African Wildlife Foundation and the

Laikipiak Maasai of Kijabe Group Ranch, who have set aside 6,500 acres for wildlife conservation. Set on an escarpment with epic views of Mount Kenya, it has four houses in different styles, plus private butlers and guards. Meanwhile down south, near Tanzania's Lake Natron, the 60,000-acre reserve **OI Donyo Laro** is home to tycoon Jan Bonde Nielsen, whose recent personal guests include George Soros and Ed Norton. It's available for hire six weeks a year, at \$250,000 a week, and comes with a Cessna, two helicopters, mobile expedition units, top guide Peter Sylvester and views which plunge 2,000ft to the Rift Välley floor.
